Ladies and gentlemen

One of the priorities of the fifth term of government has been our commitment to grow the economy and create jobs. In this regard the ANC led government has been seized with the task of ensuring inclusive growth and economic transformation by adopting a bottom-up approach which focused on the creation of industries in local communities.

This has not been an easy journey as achieving sustainable local and regional economic growth has continued to be a challenge in our Province. We attribute this on the main to the spatial economic disparities in our Province which concentrated economic development in the urban centres of our Province, that is Nelson Mandela Metro and Buffalo City Metro to the detriment of rural districts where 62 percent of our people reside. That is why many people from the rural

districts have packed their bags and followed on the footsteps of generations of migrants to look for jobs in other provinces.

We were therefore challenged to come up with solutions not only on how government can make economic growth a reality in their own localities, but also how we can make sure that the growth includes and benefits the poor within the most marginalised regions of our province. SMMEs were the vehicle through which we aimed to change this untenable situation.

However, our efforts to make headways were hampered on the main by the reluctance of commercial banks to land financial support to SMMEs. As a caring government, which is committed to economic transformation we had to intervene. Thus we established the Local and Regional Economic Development Fund in the Department of Economic Development, Environmental Affairs and Tourism to assist SMMEs in our local communities to realise their business ideas, and create jobs for our people.

We have done this by providing financial support to small, micro and medium enterprises that are starting-up and existing enterprises that are operating in the provincial priorities sectors as outlined in Provincial Economic Development Strategy which are: Agro-processing; Oceans Economy; Manufacturing; Renewable Energy; Auto Sector; creative and Tourism industries . Today, we are pleased to share with you that through the LRED Fund we have had more achievement than challenges. We say this because all the Districts of our Province have beneficiaries of the LRED Fund. Recently, through this un-discriminatory Fund we reached women owned enterprises such as Ivili Loboya that manufactures cashmere products for offshore

markets in the Amathole District and Raohang in Matatiele, a Cooperative which manufactures school uniforms and clothing items in the Alfred Nzo District. We also extended our support to youth owned enterprises such as Red Ribbon which manufactures toilet paper for commercial customers and Eastern Cape Braille, a cooperative with special needs that converts normal documents to braille documents for government departments in the Eastern Cape.

As you can see from this brief that I am sharing with you, the ANC led government does not compromise on inclusive funding to the designated groups that would ordinarily not access funding from the commercial banks.

We are here today to plant more seeds for the development of local economies in our province with an investment of R21 million. The beneficiaries have been drawn from all the Districts of our Province and are representative of designated groups. This has been a long drawn process and has been delayed at times by the challenges we experienced in the assessment and evaluation processes. Unfortunately, we had to undergo these rigorous processes as we are dealing with public funds here, that are governed by prescripts, so we must do due diligence. We will however continue to make the application process for LRED SMME friendly, without compromising on due diligence. In this regard the Department has appointed a service provider to assist applicants with business development packaging, working together with the regional staff to transfer skills and best practices.

That said, we want to emphasise to our SMMEs that LRED has a criteria and that criteria includes:

- Compliance with SARS, the Department of Labour and specific industry standards;
- Securing the security of tenure;
- · Disclosing criminal activities;
- Providing proof of markets, they intend to sell to and lastly
- Applying for sectors that fall under the Provincial Economic Development Strategy

We are pleased to announce that 16 SMMEs have passed the test and will now be able to start up their operations or expand their production and in the process create jobs in our Province. We have a message for municipalities where these SMMEs are located. We have planted this seed in your communities, do the right thing and nurture it as it will contribute towards your job creation objectives. Do not kill these emerging businesses with hefty tariffs on water, and electricity.

Instead through your LED Programmes assist them to flourish by buying products from them. If their products are good enough for the rest of us, why are they not good enough for their local municipality. We will monitor the support of our Municipalities for these 18 SMMEs as their sustainability is partly dependent of the business they will get from their local municipalities.
